Internationally acclaimed local artist Denis Kent celebrates his 80th birthday this year. This retrospective of his art works spans 52 years – 1968 – 2020. The pieces, on loan from private ownership and the artists collection, have never before been seen together. Denis has exhibited at each of the Central Otago Art Society Blossom Festival shows and over his prolific career has been recognised with a range of awards including life membership of the Central Otago Art Society. Specialising in realist landscapes and fishing or hunting themes, Kent's work encourages the viewer to imagine themselves within the atmospheric scenes. While his works reference a variety of places, Kent has a special relationship with Central Otago and Mt Aspiring National Park. This exhibition has been made possible by the Central Otago Art Society, the Central Otago District Arts Trust, Central Stories Museum and Art Gallery and the generous support of other sponsors.


